



NATIONAL CAMPDRAFT CHAMPIONSHIPS 2024

Entry Conditions

The 2024 ASHS Campdraft Championships will be held at Goondiwindi Showground, Goondiwindi, QLD from 25th – 28th July 2024.

Where there are differences between ASHS and NCCA rules, ASHS rules will take precedence.

The Society reserves the right to refuse any entry or alter the programme at their discretion.

No changes to be made to the draw on the day.

All Open Campdrafts are open to any member 13 years and over at the date of competition. No first round run restrictions, except for Ladies, Juvenile & Junior, which will be limited to 2 runs per competitor. The Juvenile Draft is for ages 13 years – under 17 years.

Riders under the age of 18 must wear a helmet whilst mounted on a horse at all ASHS events. Helmets must comply with current safety standards and be securely fastened under the chin at all times. Competitors under 18 must not handle or ride stallions within the perimeter of the grounds.

All Prizemoney will be deposited directly into Competitor's nominated bank account, please provide details when nominating.

Please note that all Prizemoney, Refunds and Scratching's will not be processed until after the conclusion of the event and will be deposited directly into Competitor's nominated bank account provided during the nomination process.

NOMINATIONS ONLY OPEN TO 2024 FINANCIAL ASHS MEMBERS AND COMPETITION ELIGIBLE REGISTERED ASH INCLUDING THE JUNIOR CAMPDRAFT. ALL COMPETITORS MUST BE 2024 FINANCIAL MEMBERS TO COMPETE.

WHEN NOMINATING PLEASE USE YOUR ASHS REGISTERED HORSE NAME AND INCLUDE YOUR HORSES' REGISTRATION NUMBER. PLEASE ALSO ADD YOUR MEMBERSHIP NUMBER.

Nominations Open: Monday 1st July 2024, 7:00 am (AEDST).

Nominations Close: Monday 8th July 2024, 7:00pm (AEDST).

Each competitor will be charged a \$15.00 per competitor First Aid fee.

Camping: \$20 per site, to be added to nominations during the nomination process. Competitors are responsible for manure removal from stables/camp sites, all areas must be left clean and tidy.

Horse Substitutions: Horse substitutions **due to injury or death are permitted up to 24 hours prior to the commencement of the event.** All Horse Substitutions are subject to verification of Horse Registration and Owner Membership and must be eligible to compete in the nominated event.

Scratchings/Refunds: A 100% refund of the nomination fee will be given if the competitor withdraws more than 168 hours (7 days prior to 8:00am on the first morning of the program). If a competitor withdraws less than 168 hours (7 days prior to 8:00am on the first morning of the program), then the entire nomination fee may be retained by the Society. If the Society deems that extenuating circumstances apply, then a refund may be granted. Each case will be at the discretion of the Society. Any refund considered will be less the cattle levy.

Changes to Nominations/Scratching's: Change to Nominations and Scratching's, during and after the nomination period, can be completed online by the competitor via Campdraft Central up until the draws are done. For Change of Rider/Scratching's updates after the draws are done please advise via email to showsec@ashs.com.au or notify ASHS staff at the Secretary's Office at the event. Change in status of horses must also be received before the commencement of the event, 25th July 2024, and the horse must be eligible for the new event.

Stallion Containment Requirements: Minimum Stallion Containment Requirements

In daylight hours, stallions must either be:

- A. Double-tied. Stallions to have an exclusion perimeter erected around the horse and area they are tied to exclude any possible interaction between the stallion and another horse or human.

OR

- B. Enclosed by panels. Stallions can be free to roam inside the panel area when an exclusion perimeter is erected around the panelled area, to exclude any possible interactions between the stallion and another horse or human. Only one horse allowed per enclosure. Panels must be a minimum of 1500mm in height. Panels must be constructed using an equivalent of 25mm box or pipe equivalent as a minimum. Panels must be anchored securely to a solid object, eg. truck, post or tree.

At night:

The same rules apply to daylight hours with the additional requirement for a stallion that is in panels there must be at least one additional form of restraint e.g. tied up, hobbles or sidelines.

Cattle Availability: Any events using cattle are subject to cattle availability at the time of the event.

Images: Any photos/videos of competitors taken by authorised photographers/videographers associated with the Australian Stock Horse Society may be used by the Society for promotional or training purposes. The Australian Stock Horse Society retains the rights for images taken at the 2024 Campdraft Championships.

Mare, Stallion & Gelding Campdrafts – NCCA rules regarding Status will apply
STATUS OF HORSE - A win in a registered breed society campdraft or invitation campdraft will alter the status of the horse as per the status of the event. If the class is unspecified, the status will be determined by the highest status of horse that competes.

Maiden Campdraft Series 27

The Maiden Campdraft Series consists of two rounds plus a final. All rounds and the final must be completed by the same horse and rider combination, except in the case of an incapacitating injury to the rider. The horse must be a Maiden on the day after the completion of the last National Show event to qualify for entry (14th May 2023).

Maiden Series Plate –Maiden Campdraft Series 27

Once a rider has won a Plate, or an event associated with the Plate Awards, they become ineligible to nominate for that Plate prize again.

Ladies Campdraft

For competitors 17 years & over and limited to 2 runs per competitor.

Youth Awards

To be eligible for Youth Awards in Open Events, competitors must be under 18 years.

Stallion Service Prizes: Any Stallion Service prizes won in any event are NON-REFUNDABLE and NON-TRANSFERABLE.

In the event of any disease outbreak/lockdown, either livestock, horse or human during the any National Event, all attendees will be responsible for their own quarantining expenses. Any NSW Health Orders or lawful quarantine orders at the time of the event will be adhered to.

All other Society Rules & Regulations are applicable to this event including the Social Media Policy.
