Section One – Led: Points will be awarded for type, conformation, movement, manners and presentation.

Section Two – Ridden Hack: To be ridden to a designated pattern. Points will be awarded accordingly.

Section Three – Ridden Working: To be ridden to a designated pattern. Points will be awarded accordingly.

Section Four – Time Trial (4yo only). A set Time Trial pattern is ridden with time penalties given as stipulated in the pattern.

No more will be asked under saddle than the above. Neat and appropriate ASH competition dress as per the ASHS Event Rules and Regulations (effective 11th September 2025) is required.

Presentations to be made at the completion of all Futurity and Maturity sections.

GENERAL RULES - In accordance with the ASHS Ltd Events Rules & Regulations (11th September 2025)

1. ASH Registration Papers and current membership **must be included with entry**.
2. All horses must be registered and competition eligible with the Australian Stock Horse Society Ltd.
3. All riders must be ASHS members to compete. Temporary Memberships are not permitted at State or National Level events, including Futurity/Maturities.
4. Any person handling a horse must be an ASHS member or temporary member. Temporary Membership \$50 (adults) and \$20 (youth) will be payable.
- 5 Horses age taken at the first of August 2025.
6. All Stallions or Colts (2 years and over) must be doubled tied by a halter and neck strap and/or hobbled at all times when not in competition, exercised, led and ridden OR housed in suitable safe accommodation, such as securely fastened panels of a suitable height.
7. When being ridden or led, Australian Stock Horse entire (2 years and over) must have a bit in their mouth and be under the control of the bit.
8. Under no circumstances are competitors under 18 years permitted to handle or ride stallions within the perimeter of the grounds.
- 9 All Competitors must wear a current ASA or international equivalent approved equestrian safety helmet & smooth soled riding boots, when mounted. All youth competitors must wear a current ASA or international equivalent approved equestrian safety helmet at all times when handling a horse.
- 10 Unruly horses may be asked to leave the competition area by Judges or Stewards.
- 11 Competitors to wear the recommended attire (as per ASH Handbook) where possible. Competitors must not display any advertising in the ring.
- 12 Protests must be lodged in writing within 30 minutes with \$50.00, this will be refunded if the protest is upheld.
- 13 The Committee reserves the right to join, divide or alter events if necessary. Trophies / Prizes may be substituted for Prize money (of the same or greater value).
- 14 STRICTLY no warming up/practicing in the Time Trial, Utility, Station Horse areas = instant disqualification.
- 15 All horses are to be ridden in a snaffle bit with the rein and cheek strap fastened to the same ring.
- 16 Competitors with multiple horses are respectfully asked to enlist the assistance of a handler to avoid time delays between classes and rings, classes may not be held.

*** Please note that if children are attending with you, they must be supervised at all times by a responsible adult***

COMPETITION STATUS - Competition status for Hack/working classes is as follows:

NEWCOMER RULES – AS OF 27TH MAY 2025

SEAMC conducts a Newcomer Final every year for horses that have not competed under saddle before the qualifying period. Eligible horses must qualify to participate in the Final, which is judged as a hack class emphasizing three quality paces, moderate collection, good manners, and an overall presentation indicative of potential for future ridden classes. The qualifying period each year commences upon the announcement of the Newcomer winner at the Vic State Championships (permitting horses to enter the Sunday challenges each year while retaining their eligibility for the next Newcomer Final). Qualifying heats will be run at each SEAMC branch show and in the show classes at the Victorian State Championships immediately preceding the Final. The top four placegetters from each qualifying round are eligible to compete in the Newcomer Final for that year. Once a horse has won a qualifying round it must not compete in another qualifying round prior to the Final round.

MAIDEN HACK - A horse that has not won a hack class at any show, open gymkhana or similar event, except wins in youth, consolation or restricted age classes (see below). Maiden horses are eligible for Champion but a win in this section will result in the horse becoming an open horse.

NOVICE HACK – A horse remains a Novice until it has won a Novice or an Open Hack class at any show, open gymkhana or similar event, except wins in age restricted, Youth and ASHLA Classes.

MAIDEN & NOVICE WORKING - same criteria as above in regards to working, utility and station horse classes. Any horse that wins an Open Championship or Supreme regardless of age will no longer be a Novice Horse. Any horse that wins a Supreme Ridden Class irrespective of age will break its Novice Status for both Hack and Working regardless of qualifying event.

Any horse that wins an Open overall Stockmans Challenge or similar event (at any event or venue) will no longer be a Maiden or Novice Horse, however a win in individual sections of a Stockmans Challenge or similar event will not affect the competition status of the horse. It is the responsibility of the owner/rider to know their horses competition status in regards to Maiden and Novice.

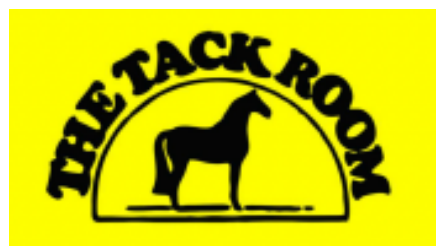
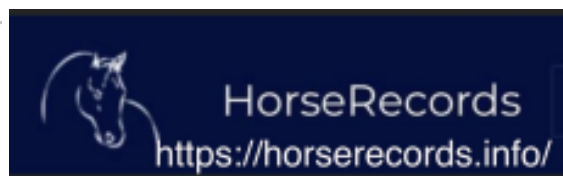

***ASH PENTATHLON CHALLENGE**

Sashes & Prizes Top 6 Overall

Ribbons for Top 3 Placings for each Event (points awarded to 6th placing). 2 points per Pentathlon Event for each horse entered (placed or not). Rider / handler must be a current financial member of ASH. Same rider/handler per horse for all Pentathlon classes unless the competitor has more than one entry, in this case the assistant (whose age is similar to the owner) may exhibit the horse in the Led class with the owner riding the horse in the remaining classes. The assistant may show the horse whilst working as a group with the owner doing the individual workout. Horses and exhibitors cannot interchange between the various Pentathlons (1 Horse – 1 Pentathlon entry) All Phases must be completed to gain an overall prize. All entries to assemble for the commencement of classes 1, 2 and 3, horse will be taken as they come for classes 4 and 5. Pentathlon Dress Code: Long sleeve shirt, preferably with a tie, denim jeans / moleskins or jodhpurs. Coat optional.
